Successes and current efforts

First region in the world with a credible possibility to reach elimination in the short term.


- Political commitment (Ministers of Health, COMISCA, RCM)
- National allocations in the GF New Funding Model progressively going through grant making and producing impactful programs.
- Improved absorption of start-up funds
- Enhanced coordination with Malaria Zero initiative
- Verification methodology piloted and currently being rolled-out.

Original Schedule

Current factors affecting the CoD

- 5 out of 9 countries have signed the CoD Agreements
- Delays in the verification process imply that 2014 reports are being verified between Nov. 2015 and March 2016.
- Final baseline still to be determined which may greatly affect estimated cases.
- Relatively short time to implement corrective measures.
- CoD mechanism still to be defined within this context.

CoD Proposal

Dependent on the signature of all the Agreements


- 2015 reported cases are adjusted based a verification to be launched in Q3 2016.
- Reward cash transfers could be made as early as Q3 2016.
- Annual awards resume from then on.

What we should continue doing

- Complete the regional elimination strategy
- Development of pending national malaria elimination strategies
- Implement Concept Notes in applicable countries including a clear path through elimination
- Maintaining of clear national funding strategies for noneligible countries
- Coordinate malaria initiatives and technical cooperation and partners
- Include findings from baseline verification
- Continue coordination of TA with all technical partners including national actors.

- Baseline results to be analyzed and detailed results informed to countries (compliance)
- work following their strategic plans and findings,
- address recommendations to improve national compliance and,
- confirm data collection and national reporting systems, among other issues,
- Prepare conditions to request verification in 2016.

Planning 2016...

- Regional Workplan to be developed:
 - Activities under responsibility of Principal Recipient ,
 - Activities under Regional Coordinating Mechanism,
 - Coordination with partners' initiatives,
 - Prepare conditions to request verification in 2016.

Challenges

Achieve:

- Full signature of agreement (5 countries pending)
- Complete baseline verification schedule (2 countries)
- Reprogramming and effective use of start-up funding
- Coordination of TC and other initiatives with partners
- Address baseline findings (compliance conditions) as fast as possible

- Keep an active agenda in countries and region
- Stakeholders commitment to solve complex situations
